 - BB It is a general service for young adults, unemployed, career changes and students.

What does transition mean?
I sit and listen to the learners voice in meetings and find out what jobs they are interested in and if they want to go into further education.





How long does a transition take?
It can take as long as it is needed, I take learners on from year 13 & 14.

Do you work as part of a team?

Yes I work alongside another person I also work with social workers and the SEND team.







Did you go to university? Yes I did a degree which was called information guidance.

Do you have a lot of paper work to fill out? Yes I have a lot of forms to fill out with their personal information, also I have to record the conversations I have with learners and their families.





Do you have many holidays? Yes I am very lucky I have 33 days a year and I am also lucky enough to have all Bank holiday days off.





What are your skills and qualities?
Good communication skills, good listener and I am helpful.

How many hours do you work, do you work weekends?

I work 37 hours over 5 days. No weekends and I don't work past 7pm.



Do you find your job rewarding.


Yes I get to meet a lot of friendly lovely people and I enjoy helping people move on and be happy.






What is your main job role?
